1. Manner in which petitioner claims to be substantially and specifically affected:

This letter is to inform the Connecticut Siting Council that I Steven Schrag, as a resident of Waterbury and Chair of the Naugatuck Valley Project Inc Jobs and Brownfields committee want to participate as an intervenor in the proceedings regarding the proposed construction of the generating facility by Waterbury Generation LLC. Many members of the community plan to attend state and local hearings.

There are many questions that we have regarding this proposed facility:

What economic analysis has been done to document claims of proposed benefit to the community?

Have other plants that have been operated by the petitioner or others that initially proposed limited operation requested expansion of operations at a later date?

How will capital depreciation schedules and property tax revaluations affect the amount of property taxes paid to the city of Waterbury?

Will the installation of power line poles from the facility affect the potential development of a riverwalk along the Naugatuck River?

What would be the potential impact of pollution from the plant if it operates more than four to six weeks per year?

What will be the economic impact on development in the area of fencing with barbed wire on the top of it?

Will the plant have the capacity to use fuels other than the proposed natural gas and oil?

What will be the health impact on Waterbury residents when the facility starts emitting nitrogen oxide, sulfur dioxide, carbon monoxide, volatile organic compounds and particulate matter?



How much money would it cost to make homes in the region more energy efficient to equal or exceed the amount of electricity that the proposed facility would create? How many jobs would that create?

2. Manner and extent to which petitioner proposes to participate:

On January 8, 2007 we will present information on our questions and raise others that are related to this proposal.

Copies of this request shall be mailed to all participants at least five (5) business days before the date of the hearing.
