With ample classroom and studio space, the Learning Lab offers training that uses the power of digital media technology to inspire learning, spark innovation and develop workforce skills in post 9/11 veterans.

Learning Lab programs are designed to meet the needs of today's citizens, and the new Veterans Vocational Training Program will help post 9/11 veterans translate their military skills into civilian jobs.

#### The Veterans Vocational Training Program

- Veterans learn from award-winning professionals in television, radio and new media production and gain real-world experience. Completion of the program leads to industry-specific certifications in digital arts or video production and includes portfolio development.
- Participants gain experience working with media professionals on digital projects and productions, ranging from live broadcasts to studio operations to web services.
- Partnerships with businesses help ensure veterans attain employment opportunities.


- Post 9/11 Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans\*
