Pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. §17a-114b and the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. §475(5)(I), the Department of Children and Families is required to provide each child, aged 16 years and older and in foster care, with his or her credit report every year until the child is discharged from care. Enclosed please find your client's credit report for the current year.

The law also requires that we request that you review this report with your client and assist in addressing any inaccuracies. Please be advised that I am also reviewing the report with the child and addressing any problems, so collaboration in this regard is welcomed.

Finally, if credit theft or identify fraud is discovered, I will report it to the Office of the Chief State's Attorney for investigation.
