Applying for Reinstatement of Pharmacist Licensure
- INSTRUCTIONS -

License To Practice Pharmacy Lapsed
For More than Two Years but Less than Five Years

A pharmacist whose license has lapsed for more than two years shall submit a statement signed under the penalty of false statement that the continuing education requirement has been satisfactorily completed in each of the years in the two-year period prior to the year of the application for renewal.

- 1) Please submit a statement signed under the penalty of false statement that the continuing education requirement has been satisfactorily completed for the two-year period prior to the year of application for renewal and copies of your continuing education certificates for the two-year period prior to the year of application to the Department of Consumer Protection, Commission of Pharmacy, 165 Capitol Avenue, Room 147, Hartford, CT 06106 or fax to (860) 713-7242.
- 2) Please submit a nonrefundable fee of \$60.00 per year for the renewal of a pharmacist license and a nonrefundable late fee of \$10.00 per year to the Department of Consumer Protection, Central Licensing, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT 06106.
The fee should be in the form of a personal check, bank check or money order made payable to 'Treasurer, State of Connecticut'.
- 3) After the Commission of Pharmacy receives a statement under the penalty of false statement that the continuing education requirement has been satisfactorily completed for the two-year period prior to the year of application, copies of your continuing education certificates for the two-year period prior to the year of application and the appropriate nonrefundable fee, your license to practice pharmacy in the State of Connecticut will be activated.

License To Practice Pharmacy Lapsed
For Five Years or more

The Commission shall not grant a renewal license to an applicant who has not held a license authorized by the Commission within five years of the date of expiration unless the applicant has passed an examination satisfactory to the Commission and has paid the required fee.

Pharmacists Licensed By Reciprocity
To Practice Pharmacy in the State of Connecticut

Pharmacists licensed by reciprocity to practice pharmacy in the State of Connecticut and who have allowed their license to lapse for five years or more must complete the reciprocity process again.

Pharmacists Licensed By Examination
To Practice Pharmacy in the State of Connecticut

Pharmacists licensed by examination to practice pharmacy in the State of Connecticut and who have allowed their license to lapse for five years or more must satisfactorily complete the continuing education requirement for the two-year period prior to the year of application, pay the required fee and successfully pass the Multi-state Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination (MPJE).

- 1) Please submit copies of your continuing education certificates for the two-year period prior to the year of application to the Department of Consumer Protection, Commission of Pharmacy, 165 Capitol Avenue, Room 147, Hartford, CT 06106 or fax to (860) 713-7242.
- 2) Please submit a nonrefundable fee of \$200.00 for the issuance of a pharmacist license to the Department of Consumer Protection, Central Licensing, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT 06106.
The fee should be in the form of a personal check, bank check or money order made payable to 'Treasurer, State of Connecticut'.
- 3) A minimum score of 75 is required to successfully complete the MPJE Examination.
 - The State of Connecticut has contracted with the National Association of the Boards of Pharmacy (**NABP**) to administer the Multi-state Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination (**MPJE**).

- To apply for the MPJE exam, you should obtain the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's **NAPLEX/MPJE Registration Bulletin and either the Internet-based registration form or Scantron registration form.**
 - ❖ The NAPLEX/MPJE Registration Bulletin is available in a PDF format on the Association's Web site, www.nabp.net. A hard-copy version is no longer published.
 - ❖ The Internet-based registration form and credit card payment fee process is available on the Association's Web site, www.nabp.net, and allows for rapid registration and convenience.
 - ❖ Scantron registration forms are available directly from either NABP or the CT Commission of Pharmacy. Completed Scantron registration forms should be mailed with the appropriate fee (bank check or money order) to NABP, P.O. Box #1057, Park Ridge, IL 60068.

The fee for taking the MPJE exam is \$200.00.

Once you are approved by NABP to take the MPJE exam, you will receive an "**Authorization to Test**" that contains the following information:

- 01.) MPJE Examination Dates
- 02.) Test Authorization Number
- 03.) Candidate Identification Number
- 04.) Expiration Date

Once you receive the "Authorization to Test", you may make an appointment at an appropriate testing center to complete the test.

- 4.) After the Commission of Pharmacy receives copies of your continuing education certificates for the two-year period prior to the year of application, a nonrefundable fee of \$200.00 and documentation of successful completion of the MPJE Examination, your license to practice pharmacy in the State of Connecticut will be activated.
