Old Business

1. Low sulfur and bio blending questions. Concerns were expressed on charges related to Public Act 10-74 and the specific scope of authority for the board. Specifically in the implementation of the act with respect to biodiesel/bioheat and the low sulfur requirements there seemed to be a lack of clarity on whether these requirements were independent or linked in terms of implementation. Frank Greene will look into getting this clarified. *Based on the act and existing statutory authority for low sulfur, it was determined that authority resides in the Dept of Environmental Protection and the Office of Policy and Management. Act requirements are dependent on surrounding states adopting substantially similar requirements. A web survey of surrounding states did not reveal uniform adoption. Board members did request that formal letters to said states should be sent though the Act is silent on this issue.*
2. Name plate capacity. What mechanisms exist to determine the accurate production locations and capacity of biodiesel/bioheat manufactures/distributors? Are there existing reporting requirements? *There are existing reporting requirements to the Energy Information Agency (EIA). EIA has not released numbers related to name plate capacity since last year. Current capacity is listed at 2 million gallons. Attempts to contact EIA were made with no call back.*
3. Emergency meetings. Contingency plans are needed to generate mechanism for the board to meet to advise the Commissioner in case of short supplies of bio product or low sulfur fuel. *Information was collected on the contact information of the members present. This information will be shared with the members.*

New business

1. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes. The motion was approved on a voice vote.
2. A motion was made and seconded to establish the next meeting date in March, 2012. The motion was approved on a voice vote.
