May

Inspection of Multi-Family Existing Dwellings
 This seminar will offer management and impact information that explains the need for and importance of inspecting multi-family occupancies. This information can be used to develop budgets and long-term plans within the fire code official's office. The class will conclude by reviewing fire and life safety matters that will serve the best interests of owners, tenants, and the local fire service. Bring a copy of Chapter 31 of Part IV of the CT Fire Safety Code to class. *Raymond Walker, Fire Marshal, Town of Vernon*

2011 NEC Chapters 5–9: Introduction to Changes
 This seminar will provide an overview of the significant changes in Special Occupancies, Special Equipment, Special Conditions, Communication Systems and Tables of the new

2011 National Electrical Code portion of the State Building Code. Important changes between the NEC 2005, 2008 and 2011 editions will be included. Hazardous (Classified) Locations, Combustible Dust, Intrinsic Safety, Electric Signs and Outline, Manufactured Wiring Systems, Electric Vehicle Charging Systems, Swimming Pools, Solar Photovoltaic Systems, Emergency Systems, Standby Systems, Optical Fiber Cables and Raceways will also be covered. *Rick Massicott, Lead Instructor, NECA & IBEW Local 90 JATC*

NFIRS Incident Reporting
 This seminar will present changes in NFIRS over the last few years, including additional rules, codes and requirements. When an incident report needs to be created; the proper incident types that should be used; proper calculations of

times entered and their definitions; using incident actions taken; proper entry of resources and personnel; the correct use of Mutual Aid; additional required modules based on incident type chosen; definitions and proper entries for fire and civilian casualties; narrative basics; and locking of reports and additional security (HIPAA, FOI, etc.) will be reviewed.

Change in Training Announcements

OEDM has been tracking Career Development attendance data for the past two-and-one-half years, and found that 42% of individuals who register for classes do not attend. This high no-show rate makes planning difficult for our instructors and our host facilities.

In an effort to project more accurate attendance estimates, OEDM is trying a new timeline for Career Development registrations. Instead of asking you to register for classes six months in advance, we will post training in two-month increments. That way you may have a better idea of your availability when you sign up.
