AMNESTY DECLARATION – TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION

POST-OCTOBER 29, 2011, STORM EVENT EMERGENCY ENGINE INFORMATION

Pursuant to section 22a-6k(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes ("CGS") the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection ("Commissioner") hereby issues a Temporary Authorization ("Authorization") to operate emergency engines, as needed in response to the October 29, 2011 storm event, as is more specifically described below in the SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION. The operation performed shall conform to the terms and conditions of this Authorization. The purpose of this Authorization is to protect the public interest and human health by authorizing temporary operation of emergency engines.

SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION

The following temporary activity is hereby approved in the State of Connecticut:

Temporary operation of emergency engines without regard to limitations on hours of operation or the quantity of fuel consumed, notwithstanding requirements that may be imposed pursuant to the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies promulgated under Chapter 446c of the Connecticut General Statutes, or orders or permits issued by the Commissioner of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection or his designee.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Authorization shall include operation of any emergency engine from October 29, 2011 through November 14, 2011. If not otherwise authorized pursuant to Section 22a-6k(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes, on November 15, 2011 all owners and operators of emergency engines shall resume compliance with requirements imposed pursuant to the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies promulgated pursuant to Chapter 446c of the Connecticut General Statutes, and orders and permits issued by the Commissioner of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection or his designee.

Operation of engines not otherwise described in the Scope of Authorization is not authorized herein.
