The Governor's Council on Climate Change (GC3) will hold a second round of stakeholder events on Tuesday, July 26th, 5:30pm-7:30pm (refreshments available at 5:00pm). Nearly 200 people participated in Round 1 on May 5th (see [photos, video and other information](#)).

Participants in the July stakeholder event will have an opportunity to learn about the initial results of the modeling scenarios, provide feedback to the GC3 members on the measures and technologies incorporated into each scenario, and engage in local dialogue about some of the policy implications of the initial results: Which activities should be prioritized for early implementation? What criteria should be used in identifying the communities/regions where we should focus limited resources in the short-term?

The Hartford Public Library will be hosting the primary event, with nine satellite locations around the state (see list of locations below) and a live viewing via a web browser. Participants at the satellite locations will view the presentations and then engage in facilitated dialogue at the local level. Light refreshments will be available beginning at 5:00pm.
