

Proposed Amendments to WAP State Plan – February 2011

➤ On-File Revisions:

- ❖ Health and Safety Plan
 - Expanded to address compliance with WPN 11-06
 - Includes updated deferral standards
 - Lead-Safe Weatherization updated to state compliance with LRRP regulations.
 - Expenditures increased to \$1,500 average per unit (subject to review).
 - Language has been inserted to clearly state that replacement of operable CO and smoke detectors is not an allowable use of health and safety funds.
- ❖ Air Sealing
 - Cost has increased to \$210 for a 2-man crew (\$60 material and \$150 labor) per hour. Cost for a 1-man crew is \$105 (\$30 material and \$75 labor) per hour.
 - Includes language regarding compliance with ASHRAE 62.2
 - Use of 2-part foam for air sealing
 - Measures that are part of the airsealing cost has been updated to include weatherstripping and door sweeps, with the provision that this will only occur after the higher costs are implemented.
- ❖ Audit Tool
 - Language has been revised to address current operations with software audit and current and on-going relationship with the vendor, Conservation Services Group (CSG).
 - Language has been revised to state that all measures are subject to an individual SIR of 1 or more
- ❖ Historic Preservation
 - Language has been inserted to highlight compliance with Section 106 review
 - DSS-OPM-SHPO Programmatic Agreement has been referenced
- ❖ Window and Door Replacements
 - Clarifies DOE position that all window and door replacements must receive an individual SIR of 1 or more.
- ❖ Attic Insulation
 - Language has been inserted stating Connecticut's intent to increase insulation to R-49 once audit tool is able to screen for the increased amount of insulation.
- ❖ Window and Door Replacements
 - Clarifies DOE position that all window and door replacements must receive an individual SIR of 1 or more.
- ❖ Training & Technical Assistance
 - Updated to reflect current training process, which includes use of BPI curriculum for auditor certification
- ❖ Monitoring Approach
 - Updated to reflect current realities of CT-WAP program
- ❖ Policy Advisory Council
 - It has been changed in the on-file to note that the Low Income Energy Assistance Board will serve as the Policy Advisory Council.
