*The Book and the Rose* is based on a short story by Max Lucado. It played in 56 film festivals throughout the world, winning 27 first place awards and in 2003 became one of ten semi-finalists for an Oscar for best short film. The film has developed a devoted audience, having broadcast on KQED, WGBH, WGBY and TBN. The film is also available on Netflix. *The Book and the Rose* was produced by Eric Kmetz and written and directed by Jeff Bemiss, who resides in Enfield, CT.

Jeff and the same team of filmmakers are preparing to shoot a feature length film entitled *A Long Tomorrow* in New England in 2011. Based on a story by Jack Finney (*Invasion of the Body Snatchers*, *The Love Letter*, Steven Spielberg's *Amazing Stories*), *A Long Tomorrow* is a romantic drama in the fantastical tradition of *The Lake House*, *The Time Traveler's Wife*, *The Curious Case of Benjamin Button*, and *Somewhere in Time*.
