Implement Regional Performance Incentive Program grants – Help with Regional Performance Incentive Program grants and assist in related efforts to coordinate Geospatial Information Systems (GIS) projects being developed by Regional Planning Organizations (RPOs).

Coordinate Transit-Oriented Development – Aid in coordinating Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) plans and projects within and across affected planning regions.

Revise the State Plan of Conservation and Development – Assist in developing and implementing the next revision to the State Plan of Conservation and Development (C&D Plan).

Organize Regional Roundtables – Coordinate and participate in Regional Roundtables in order to receive input from city and town officials to develop planning agendas tailored to the specific needs of different planning regions.

Review Municipal Data – Assist the Intergovernmental Policy Division in collecting, analyzing and publishing municipal data, including Municipal Fiscal Indicators.

Learn about the Legislative Process for the State of Connecticut – Discover what role OPM has in the Legislative Process and how hard work at OPM translates into legislative action.

Work with other interns on agency-wide projects – Build relationships with the other interns as well as learn about each person's unique experience.
